


The SMVRR History

- SMVRR was constructed in 1911 to haul crude oil, produce and sugar beets and provide shipping for other goods in and out of the Valley
- Purchased by Captain Allan Hancock in 1925
- The Railroad continued to expand and is still serving agriculture and industry today



- Preserve the Right-of-Way of the SMVRR from College Drive East to the Gates Station
- Preserve the Captain Allan Hancock Rail Corridor
- Continue the process in order to determine the highest and best community uses
