2nd Annual Train Show in the Mall

The Santa Maria Valley Railway Historical Museum (SMVRHM) hosted the 2nd Annual Model Railroad Exhibition February 26-27, 2005 in the Santa Maria Town Center Mall. In this year's "Centennial Exhibition", participants from three California Freemo groups (San Luis Obispo, Los Angeles and Northern California) assembled one of the largest "Freemo" layouts ever in California. The twoday event was held in conjunction with the Santa Maria Chamber of Commerce and the Santa Maria Town Center Mall.

"For having fewer modules this year, the layout seemed MUCH larger! The Guadalupe yard presented by the SMVRHM was a terrific addition to the layout and the much cramped Mojave Yard sections."

"Bob and I were relieved that the much anticipated rebuilt wye worked as promised and became an asset to the setup rather then a liability. More of this sort of reworking will happen to the older modules like Arness proper, so it will share the same benefits to being 100% Free-mo and DCC enabled."

"The RPM event was great! More locals showed their work then last year and a few guests from LA (Dave Hussey and Paul Federiconi) helped reinforce the fact that this was for real. I hope we can keep the upward motion for the Santa Maria RPM display in place."
